1. <u>RULES</u>

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016*.
- 1.2. No national prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3. Racing rule G1.1(b) is deleted. National letters will not be required.
- 1.4. English will be the official language. If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

2. <u>BOATS</u>

- 2.1. Competitors may use charter boats provided by the organizing authority or use their own boats.
- 2.2. Charter Boats will be allocated according to the following availability:
 - 2.2.1.Up to 40 used 2010-2014 charter boats in excellent conditions (only hull, mast & spars and dolly). The organizing authority will reserve one charter boat per every 5 qualifying spots per nation (NSCA) as allocated by ISCA. Each NSCA will have up to July 31st, 2015 to reserve and pay for charter boats. NSCA willing to secure more 2015 charter boats (up to the NSCA limit) shall pay the charter fee to register on a wait list that will be used after the above deadline.
 - 2.2.2. The charter boats will be randomly allocated up to the charter boat limit provided the NSCA quota is not exceeded.
 - 2.2.3.Competitors from any NSCA who bring their own boat, will have their registration accepted unconditionally provided the NSCA quota is not exceeded.
 - 2.2.4.Equipment supplied may be found in Addendum 1.
- 2.3. Failure of privately owned or equipment provided by the organizing authority is not grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

3. ADVERTISING

3.1. In accordance with ISAF Regulation 20.4.2, only advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority may be displayed on boats or parts thereof (hull, spars, sails, etc.).

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. Entries shall be limited to 50 competitors.
- 4.2. Sailors must not reach their 19th birthday during the 2015 calendar year.
- 4.3. Each competitor shall be a current year (2015) member of his/her respective country's Sunfish Class Association.
- 4.4. Maximum 5 spots for each non-US NSCA (National Sunfish Class Association)
- 4.5. Maximum 8 spots for USSCA (US Sunfish Class Association)
- 4.6. 5 additional spots for Peru as the host country

5. ENTRY FEES

5.3. Registration fee includes as a minimum: opening ceremony cocktail, awards ceremony dinner and lunch bags on racing days. Additional activities will be announced at registration.

- 5.4. Registration and charter fees are in US Dollars and shall be free of any transfer and/or banking costs and/or commissions. Any charge shall be reimbursed by competitors to complete their registrations.
- 5.5. Registration and charter fees are non-refundable, unless all 50 spots are filled by the date of the regatta. Refunds of entry fees are subject to a 10% administrative fee.
- 5.6. Eligible competitors may apply by completing the registration form available in Addendum 2 and online at <u>http://sunfishclass.org/worlds</u>. Peruvian participants shall pay their registration fees directly to the organizing authority.
- 5.7. Registrations are not considered official until all fees have been received.
- 5.8. Registration deadline: August 31st, 2015. Immediately after the registration deadline, the Class Office will release all reserved spots that are unused. Only NSCAs with paid dues by August 31st, 2015 will be considered for this reservation, subject to availability.
- 5.9. Damage deposits will be refunded if the boat is returned in its original condition. Any damages beyond the value of the deposit amount may result in additional fees.

6. <u>SCHEDULE</u>

6.2 Three races may be sailed per day. One extra race per day may be sailed provided that the series becomes no more than one race ahead of Schedule.

6.3 On Sunday, October 11, no warning signal will be made after 15:00 hours.

6.4 Races are back to back with lunch on the water.

7 MEASUREMENT

7.1 Competitor owned boats must be measured by the ISCA Chief Measurer or his appointed representatives. Boats must be compliant with current ISCA rules. Boats may be selected for remeasurement at any time during the regatta by the International Jury, the ISCA Chief Measurer or his appointed representatives. Measurement will take place on Thursday Oct. 08 from 9:00 – 18:00.







- 7.2 Charter boats and equipment supplied by the organizing authority must be compliant with current ISCA rules. Boats may be selected for re-measurement at any time during the regatta by the International Jury, the ISCA Chief Measurer or his appointed representatives.
- 7.3 The organizing authority has the option of pre-measuring all charter boats and their equipment deeming them compliant with current ISCA rules prior to releasing them for charter.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at check-in for the regatta.

9. <u>VENUE</u>

The regatta venue will be the "Yacht Club Peruano" located in Paracas. Racing will be in the waters of the Paracas Bay Natural Reserve, 250 kms south of Lima, in the province of Ica – Peru. Further information about the race area may be found in Addendum 5.

10. THE COURSES

- 10.1 The preferred courses to be sailed will be a 5 leg windward-leeward course with the finish to windward.
- 10.2 An optional course to be sailed will be a 6 leg triangle course with the finish line to windward.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1 Appendix P will apply.
- 11.2 Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in Rule 70.5.

12. SCORING

- 12.1 Three completed races are required to constitute a series.
- 12.2 A maximum of 9 races will be sailed.
- 12.3 When fewer than six (6) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.4 When six (6) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12.5 Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in Rule 70.

13. <u>SUPPORT BOATS</u>

- 13.1 The organizing authority will not provide support boats (please refer to Appendix II for options).
- 13.2. Support boats include those carrying team leaders, coaches and other personnel that interact with competitors.
- 13.3 Support boats shall be marked with a flag with the nation letters.
- 13.4 Support boats shall stay outside the racing area from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. The racing area is defined as no less than 100 meters from any boats that are racing and outside the laylines from the marks defining the course.
- 13.5 Support boats shall remain 50 meters below the starting line between the preparatory and starting signals. After the starting signal they may only proceed to the windward mark up the right side of the course and must return to the leeward mark via the same side. At the finish line, they must remain 100 meters to windward of the extensions of the finish line.
- 13.6 It is recommended that support boats carry VHF radios.
- 13.7 No communication from the support boats (including verbal and hand signals) will be permitted after the preparatory signal until after the competitor completes the race.







- 13.8 If a support boat does not comply with applicable rules, restrictions and/or instructions, a discretionary penalty may be applied by the International Jury to some or all associated competitors and may include restrictions on the movement of their support boat.
- 13.9 Support boats may be required to act as safety boats upon instruction from a race official.

14. PRESS / PHOTOGRAPHY BOATS

- 14.1 Press or photography boats may be supplied or authorized by the organizing authority.
- 14.2 Press or photography boats shall be marked with a flag with a letter "P".
- 14.3 Press/photography boats shall stay outside the laylines to the marks defining the course while boats are racing and shall not maneuver so as to interfere with or influence boats racing.
- 14.4 Press/photography boats shall obey instructions related to boat positioning or operations from onthe-water race officials.

15. <u>BERTHING</u>

15.1 Boats shall be kept at the regatta site and in spots assigned by the organizing authority.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATION

16.1 Except in an emergency, a support boat shall neither make radio transmissions during a race nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

17. <u>PRIZES</u>

- 17.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
 - a) Top five finishers
 - b) Highest placed Female finisher (if the top finisher is male) or the highest placed Male finisher (if the top finisher is Female)
 - c) Each race winner (max 9)
 - d) Youngest Participant
 - e) Sportsmanship Award

18. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 18.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 18.2 See Appendix I for the Entry & Waiver Form that must be completed prior to competing in this regatta.

19. INSURANCE

19.1 The organizing authority recommends that each participating boat shall be insured with valid thirdparty liability insurance.

20. <u>REQUESTS FROM OFFICIALS</u>

20.1 Team leaders, coaches, support personnel and competitors shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

21. LODGING / MEALS / TRANSPORTATION

21.1 See Addendum 4 for details.

- $\hfill \square$ Removable mast cleat for halyard (no holes to be drilled) and padding/hardware to attach
- \square Tiller extension with universal fitting compatible with receiver fitting provided on tiller
- \Box Line, shock cord or other Class approved materials for securing or raising the hiking strap
- □ Flexible mainsheet hanger(s)
- $\hfill\square$ Wind indicators and/or telltales
- □ Thimbles in line purchases where allowed
- \Box Compass and/or stopwatch
- $\hfill\square$ Paper or other sheet material temporarily taped to deck and pen or pencil for recording notes
- □ Tape or Velcro (but not allowed in centerboard trunk or mast step)

Other Actions: Use of any other equipment or materials not mentioned in this addendum are prohibited. This includes but is not limited to prohibit the use of anything in the centerboard trunk or mast step, application of sealants or anything other than soap on the hull or blades.

Addendum 5 2015 SUNFISH YOUTH WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Race Area – Bahía de Paracas, Ica (PERU) and other important information:







Travel and distance from Lima to Paracas by car: Lima - Paracas: 3hrs - 250 km (155 miles).

The race area of the event will be located in Paracas Bay, 22 kms south of Pisco, 7 kms north of Ica and 250 kms south of Lima.

Paracas has an average annual temperature of 22°C, mostly sunny.

Paracas Bay (source Wikipedia): Paracas bay, with its southern end lying within the <u>Paracas National Reservation</u> is well known for its abundant wildlife. The unique ecosystem, insulated from thrashing ocean waves and current by <u>Paracas Peninsula</u>, and its shallow warmer waters, stimulates a remarkable growth of seaweed for which much of the wildlife, particularly <u>the birds of Paracas</u>, thrive upon directly or indirectly. The bay appears as the gateway to <u>Paracas</u>. <u>National Reserve</u>, its warmer shallow waters foster wildlife and many nautical sports, and its calm shoreline protects the municipality of <u>Paracas</u> and the various cottages and hotels that have sprung up in the last few years. As of recent years, the bay has hosted many sailors on catamarans and kitesurfers seeking the flat water and strong wind found in the bay (source: Wikipedia).

Paracas Peninsula (source Wikipedia): The **Paracas Peninsula** is a desert peninsula within the boundaries of the <u>Paracas National Reservation</u>, a marine reserve which extends south along the coast. The only marine reserve in Peru,

it is a designated <u>UNESCO World Heritage Site</u>. The peninsula is located within the <u>Paracas District</u> of the <u>Pisco</u> <u>Province</u> in the <u>Ica Region</u>, on the south coast of <u>Peru</u>. This unusual peninsula may be best known for the <u>Paracas</u> <u>Candelabra</u>, a prehistoric <u>geoglyph</u> nearly 600 feet (183 m) tall on the north face of the peninsula ridge. Pottery nearby was dated to 200 BCE, placing it within the <u>Paracas culture</u>.^[1] Its origins and purpose have inspired many theories.

A shipping port was built along the northern peninsula, where deeper water permits larger transport and cruise ships to anchor. Tourists can have access to the <u>Paracas National Reservation</u>, a large marine reserve, while the ships are protected against ocean waves and currents. The peninsula includes red sand beaches formed from sands eroded from nearby cliffs.

The port is reached by a single road from the mainland, that goes through the <u>Paracas National Reservation</u>. The <u>Centre Museum</u>, also called the Paracas Museum, holds several ancient artifacts from the Paracas Culture. It also provides detailed information and interpretation about the flora and fauna native to the Reservation, including the many varieties of <u>birds of Paracas</u>.

Other lodging alternatives:

In the following map you might find other lodging options in Paracas. The most important hotels are: Double Tree Hilton Paracas (venue), Hotel Libertador Paracas (Starwood), Hotel La Hacienda Paracas, Hotel Aranwa Paracas and Hotel San Agustín Paracas. Three Star Hotels are: El Mirador and La Posada del Enmancipador. There are more convenient hotels located near Playa El Chaco, among them: Brisas de la Bahia and for backpackers the Backpackers House.
